Uganda Partners had another productive year in 2016. In February, we hosted a fundraising event in Pittsburgh to bid farewell to outgoing Board President Sherman White.

Uganda Partners coordinated the travels and speaking opportunities for Dr. Senyoni. His travels included Uganda Partners board meetings, the Pittsburgh fundraising event, CCCU Presidents meetings, multiple church visits, Trinity International University visit, and a visit to Westmont College (where he met with faculty and the first Global Health students who would study at UCU in Fall 2016).

Global5K: More than 130 supporters across six continents supported the Honours College Scholarship Fund by participating in the Global5K.

Uganda Partners began a matching grant fundraising campaign for science laboratory equipment for UCU.

With logistical support from Uganda Partners, Patty Huston-Holm offered her second year of service leading postgraduate writing workshops. She also coordinated a workshop in grant writing to assist students and faculty seeking grant funds for research projects.

Beginning August 2016, Jordan McGurran joined Uganda Partners at UCU—assisting with grants and academic programs through the Center for Global Engagement.

Mark Bartels assisted Tom and Jayne Gurley with a team from St. Andrews (Mt. Pleasant,

SC) visiting UCU during the October 2016 graduation.

Uganda Partners facilitated Larry Adams' visit to UCU, where he was introduced to UCU's African Policy Center, a think tank engaging the political sphere from a Christian perspective. He has since returned to UCU and is exploring how to assist and partner with the African Policy Center.

Uganda Partners received another grant to assist with the Institute on Faith, Learning and Service with the aim of helping the different academic departments serve local communities and incorporate community service into the curriculum.
